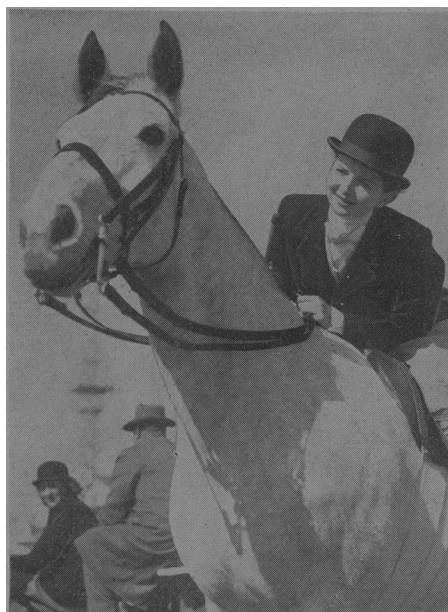

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MANSFIELD SHOW REGULATIONS

- All exhibits to be entered at owner's risk.
- All exhibits must be the Bona Fide property of, and all produce must be grown or manufactured by the Exhibitor. Joint exhibits must be jointly owned.
- Entry Fees must be paid on making entries, which must be submitted in writing on forms supplied by the Society.
- Entries close on Wednesday 16th November 2011. NO LATE ENTRIES will be accepted.**
- Entries submitted by mail should enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope if exhibitor is unable to personally collect exhibit number tickets.
- The Judges may award special prizes for exhibits which they consider worthy and for which no section is provided. They may also use their discretion as to whether first or any prize should be awarded in any section.
- In Stock Classes, no Steward shall wear a Steward's badge if he or she is exhibiting stock in the Class for which he or she is acting as Steward.
- A Steward who is an exhibitor in his or her particular class or classes may remain in attendance while the sections in which he or she is interested in are being judged.
- Only exhibitors holding a Member's Ticket or Exhibitor's Ticket will be admitted free to the grounds.
- Classes L, M Q, QA, R, S, T, V & VAS Ltd exhibits may be left with the Stewards on THURSDAY 17th November afternoon between 4.00pm and 6.00pm. Exhibits to be set up and ready for **JUDGING, WHICH WILL TAKE PLACE ON FRIDAY AT 1.00PM.** Class O & P exhibits must be staged and ready for judging by 9.00am on Show Day.
- Pavilion entries in all Classes must be left on exhibition until 4.30pm SATURDAY before collection.
- Prize money will be paid on presentation of the Society's voucher signed by the exhibitor at the Secretary's Office. Prize money will be paid out after 4.30pm.
- Prize money not claimed or collected before the end of February will not be recognised or paid.
- All protests or objections in connection with the Show must be made in writing and lodged with a deposit of \$10 with the Secretary not later than Monday following the Show. Such matters will be dealt with at the next ordinary meeting of the Society's Council. The deposit may be forfeited if the protest is found to be frivolous.
- Exhibits may be offered for sale, provided that the Secretary is notified and the price stated at time of entry; 10 per cent of the proceeds will go to the funds of the Society.
- The Society will not, under any circumstances, hold itself liable for any accidents on the grounds or premises.
- The Society does not accept responsibility for any errors or omissions in the Prize Schedule.
- All entry fees include GST.
